Trails

1. **General Maintenance**: I think we managed to hike every trail and remove the big stuff, trim the edges, etc.



2. **Signage**: 4x4 posts were installed at most of the intersections of walking trails and signs were affixed to help hikers find their way. Special kudos to the brave souls who dug the post holes in the pouring rain.



3. **Strawberry Shortcut**: a new trail was laid out from the bottom of the logging road that goes from the Timber Trail down toward Strawberry Hill - and the Strawberry Hill unit. Now campers can access the trail system from behind the unit, just as they can from Sprucewood, Hawthorne Grove, and Sunset.

- 4. **Hawthorne Grove Entrance to Timber Trail**: There is now a more well defined path from Hawthorne Grove to the Timber Trail.
- 5. Old Timber Trail Sign: We removed it.

Boot Brush Station (Plus)

1. Educational station: This boot brush station with an educational sign was an in-kind grant from the WNY PRISM (Partnership for Regional Invasive Species Management). This station was installed behind the Trading Post. We hope summer campers, troop campers, and non-Girl Scout groups who visit camp will learn about how our dirty boots can transmit seeds from one location to another, spreading non-native plants. We hope all will be inspired to be conscientious about cleaning their boots before and after hiking. (The sign itself must have been delivered to Ro's house Saturday - one day too late to make it into her car with other Work Weekend Stuff. She will sneak back to camp and install it by Memorial Day.)







2. **Practical stations**: To minimize the amount of dirt brought inside, two brushing stations (without signs) were installed - one at the NW entrance to Bellinger, and one in front of Jackman. We definitely saw a difference in the amount we had to sweep up!

Drainage Pit

An experimental drainage pit was installed around one of the spigots in Sprucewood using a galvanized steel fire ring from Amazon. It will need to be filled with gravel, and we recommend gravel outside the ring, too, where the girls would be standing to access the spigot. If this works well this summer, we can install more at future work weekends.





The Units

1. Latrines: Our Friends were blown away by the excellent spruce-up job that was done on the latrines. That was a job we started at a previous work weekend, but it was too big to finish in just a couple of days. Thank you to Council staff / contractors for finishing up. One of our Friends said, "You could eat dinner in here; it is so clean!"

We installed a toilet paper dispenser in the middle stall at Jackman as an experiment. Will it deter mice? Let's keep an eye on it and see. If it works, we could consider more for other latrines.



2. **Fire Circles**: Fire Circles were tidied up in all the units. This was a dirty job:



- 3. **Shelter Lighting**: LED lighting units were installed inside the Sprucewood and Strawberry Hill shelters. Hawthorne Grove was well lit. Sunset has no electricity.
- 4. General: Some efforts were made to tidy up around the tents more generally. It was obvious that some raking around the tents had been done before we got there, but there is still a lot of trimming, and removal of dead and rotting wood piles, etc, that could be done to make the units more appealing. We got started, but more work will need to be done.



Programs for Girls

1. Tidbits: Slingshots & Archery

Nine girls braved the rain to take part in our Timbercrest Tidbits workshops. The Daisies and Brownies learned safety and techniques related to using slingshots for target practice. The older Girl Scouts learned safety and techniques related to archery.





2. Nesting Platforms

Consider this clever scheduling by Ro: While the older girls were getting their "chalk talk" before going to the archery range, the younger girls were at the range practicing target skills with slingshots. When the older girls went to the range to practice archery skills, the younger girls built nesting platforms. Our hope is to discourage the swallows from nesting on our lighting fixtures (by installing "spikes" - eventually) and giving them places away from doors and windows to minimize poo and dive-bombing where people walk.





Bellinger

1. **Kitchen**: More light switches were labeled, as were drawers! The kitchen crew cleaned out all the drawers and shelves, disposed of lids with no bottoms and bottoms with no lids as well as broken items, moved like tools into common places, and cleaned and cleaned and cleaned. Bill taught Jennifer how to clean the griddle!



2. **Game Shelves**: A quick review of a couple of the games proved that some were incomplete. Unusable games were disposed of, duplicates were assessed to make sure all had the appropriate pieces and parts, etc.



Items of Concern

We reported the following items to council, pointing out that some are safety issues and need fairly immediate attention:

1. An open drain pit at the end of the drainage ditch between Sprucewood and Hawthorne Grove.



2. A broken and open culvert just below Sprucewood. It is marked with a post.



3. A big dead ash tree on the back side of the Strawberry Hill Shelter that must have been overlooked when trees were cut last year. It is a threat to the building if it falls.



 A <thing> (not sure what it is) along the path leaving the dam to go toward Bellinger.



- 5. The doorknob on the west door of Bellinger that goes out onto the deck needs some attention. It is loose, making it hard to close the door properly.
- 6. There are yellow jackets in the tan yurt. We're not sure where they are coming from.

- 7. The shower head / hose in the handicap shower of Jackman needs to be replaced.
- 8. We installed a galvanized steel ring around a spigot in Sprucewood. It needs to be filled with gravel. We think gravel around the outside of it may also be useful to provide a place where girls can stand when accessing the spigot.
- 9. A couple of the new picnic tables that our Friends raised money for, built, stained, and had plaques made for are sitting in the weeds over by the yurts. As you can imagine, folks were not happy to see that our investment is unused. Please move them into spots where they will be used.
- 10. The Freezer in Jackman does not freeze things.

Addendum

A few of us returned to camp over Memorial Day weekend and finished up a couple of tasks:

1. The educational Boot Brush Station.
